

MARITIME DECARBONISATION: ALTERNATIVE FUELS, SHORE POWER & REGULATIONS - 18 SEPTEMBER 2025

With rising pressure on shipping lines to plug in and reduce emissions, collaboration between industry, government, and energy providers is critical. This session will explore the evolving regulatory landscape shaping maritime decarbonisation, via two panel discussions – highlighting the EU Emissions Trading Scheme (EU ETS), cold ironing mandates, and the IMO's revised strategy to cut greenhouse gas emissions by 40% by 2030 and reach net zero by 2050. These measures are accelerating the industry's shift toward clean energy, increasing the need for investment in shore power, alternative fuels like ammonia, methanol, and hydrogen, and upgrades to grid capacity at ports.
