The seminar

For several years container ships have been experiencing fires in containers loaded on board. This has resulted in major damage to ships, cargo, containers and unacceptable fatalities amongst mariners. Mis-declaration remains a major challenge, but even cargoes stowed in accordance with the IMDG Code start fires, while others have the potential to enhance the speed at which the fire spreads. Container ships have significantly increased in size but SOLAS firefighting and protection regulations have not evolved at the same pace, leaving crews facing major challenges in deploying the resources currently available on board.

This conference will explore some of the reasons for those fires and what needs to be done to reduce the risks and avoid loss of life. The programme will also discuss:

- the nature and extent of cargo fires on board container vessels
- whether current IMDG regulations are a contributing factor and to what extent, if any, is reform needed
- the major challenge of mis-declared cargoes
- what are the human and financial costs to stakeholders
- are current fire-fighting equipment and techniques sufficient to enable ships' crews to halt or delay the spread of fire
- what, if any, changes to current SOLAS regulations and ship design are needed.
